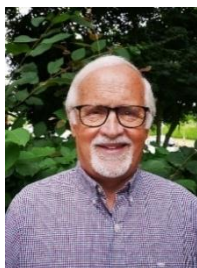

Over the course of more than 30 years, Rowe has held presidencies at three independent institutions at the K - 12, college, and graduate level and served as university trustee and as vice president for advancement. Rowe guided Lancaster Theological Seminary as interim president through its first full year of online instruction and remote work while finalizing a definitive agreement for a merger with Moravian University.
