Taking the Wise Stewards journey:

A pathway to enhanced board effectiveness

Participation in the Wise Stewards Initiative empowers governing boards of theological schools as agents of institutional change through one-on-one coaching, board self-assessment, peer learning, and immersion into governance habits for long-term effectiveness. Follow these steps to enhance your experience.

1

RALLY YOUR BOARD When: Before the year Who: President & board

Participation in the Wise Stewards Initiative is not for the faint of heart. To ensure the fullest benefit from the Initiative, it's crucial that all members of your board understand and are willing and ready to put in the work that will be asked of them.

MEET YOUR COACHWhen: In the fall Who: President & coach

Get to know your Wise Stewards coach through a meet-and-greet phone conversation that includes the board chair and president. This is the opportunity to clarify expectations, define roles, and declare commitments for the year.

ASSESS PERFORMANCE When: Late August Who: All members of the board

In late August, members of your board will complete a board assessment designed by the In Trust Center specifically for boards of theological schools. (Make sure everyone does it.) The asset introduces your board to the six principles of exemplary board governance that are foundational to the whole of your Wise Stewards experience.

INTERACT WITH FINDINGS When: Fall/Winter Who: Board, president & coach

Your governance coach will facilitate a board education session during your fall (preferred) or winter board meeting, focusing on the findings from the assessment. The board will identify a short (3-5 items) list of technical issues suggested by the assessment as needing their immediae attention.

CONVERSE WITH PEERS When: During the year Who: Board & administration

Monthly facilitated Zoom conversations provide opportunity for members of your board and administrative team to engage with peers from within the cohort around issues critical to effective board governance.



LEARN ALONGSIDE PEERS When: March Who: Your 4-person team & peers

With board tune-up work completed, your team will arrive at the Wise Stewards Seminar in March ready to tackle issues of longer-term consequence. Over the course of two days, your team of four will work along-side peers in exploring big-picture challenges. You'll be encouraged to dig deeper into the six essentials of exemplary board governance and to think strategically about the board's role in driving change.





DEVELOP A PLAN

When: After seminar Who: President, board & coach

Beginning at the seminar and continuing in the weeks following, your team will lay out the framework of a longer-term plan for moving your board from technical adjustments to generative thinking and leadership. Coaching time is available to assist with this work.



SUM IT UP

When: October after the year Who: President & board

The final step in your Wise Stewards year is to prepare a brief report outlining the benefits to your board of participation in the Wise Stewards Initiative. The report should also include next steps for continuing board development for sustained change in the way the board performs.
